Christiane Eberhardt is clinical vaccinologist and head of the Center for Vaccinology of the University Hospitals of Geneva. After her board exam (FMH) as pediatrician in 2014, she specialized in clinical vaccinology and vaccineimmunology. She received a Master's degree with distinctions in Immunology of Infectious Diseases from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, UK and gained extensive experiences in vaccine-immunology with Prof. Claire-Anne Siegrist where she conducted a policychanging clinical study on the timing of maternal pertussis immunization. From 2017 to 2019 she was postdoctoral research fellow at the Emory Vaccine Center, Atlanta, US,



and focused on the understanding of human B-cell and CD8 T-cell immunology in the context of vaccination and viral infections. In 2019 she returned to the Center for Vaccinology in Geneva, where she now develops vaccination programs and individualized vaccination approaches for adult immunocompromised patients. In 2022, she obtained her PD accreditation with a thesis on COVID-19 vaccination and the role of T cells in immunocompromised adults. Since 2023, she is head of the Center of Vaccinology and medical referent of the routine vaccinology laboratory of the University Hospitals of Geneva (HUG) and Infovac expert.
